BODH Mentorship Programme

The BODH Mentorship Programme:

BODH is a structured mentorship journey that blends syllabus completion, answer writing, revision, and test discussions — supported by personalised mentor guidance at every **step**. It ensures disciplined preparation, accountability, and exam-oriented confidence.

BODH Mentorship Programme Comprises 2 Integrated Parts:

- 1. Mains Answer Writing & Mentorship (August to January): 60 structured tests, 250+ answers, intensive mentorship + Weekly Prelims Questions Solving + Discussion.
- 2. Prelims Preparation (February to April): Full-length tests attempted by students of other institutes and discussed with mentor on One-to-One basis, revision-driven practice, offline & online modes.

BODH Mentorship Programme – At a Glance

Philosophy

Structured journey combining syllabus completion, answer writing, revision, and test discussions.

Mains Answer Writing:

3 sessions/week till January (~60 days).

Mains Focus Features:

Targeted subject coverage, short notes support, dedicated revision cycles, tracked progress, and 24/7 mentor guidance.

Prelims Preparation:

Start with **PYQ** analysis + external practice. Shift to Prelimsonly mode in February.





Mains Answer Writing Guidance

Frequency and Duration:

- 3 answer-writing sessions every week.
- Runs until the **end of January**, giving around 60 writing days.

Practice Volume:

- 4 to 5 questions per session, adding up to over 250 questions in total.
- Combination of syllabus keyword-based questions and previous year questions (2016 - 2024).

Test and Feedback Cycle:

- Tests are conducted on a **fixed calendar** shared in advance.
- **Model answers** are released the next day for comparison.
- Evaluation is completed within 48 hours and answer copies shared over email with detail feedback.
- One-to-one personalised feedback sessions follow every test, with in-depth discussion of each question.
- Progress is tracked across cycles to ensure continuous improvement.

Question Design:

- Strict alignment with **UPSC previous year question patterns** (2016 2024).
- Balanced focus on **static themes** such as federalism, poverty, agriculture, and ethics, along with current affairs from 2019 - 2025.

Learning Outcomes:

- Completion of more than **250 exam quality** answers by **January**.
- Practice of **two to three UPSC-standard questions** for every syllabus keyword.
- Consistent improvement through the cycle of practice, model answers, and mentor reviews.

Prelims Preparation Roadmap

• **Parallel Start with Prelims**: Alongside Mains preparation, aspirants will simultaneously begin focused preparation for the Prelims stage.

Foundation through PYQs

- o The first step will be to solve and analyse previous year questions in depth.
- o A detailed analysis session will be conducted every **10 to 12 days** to identify patterns, recurring themes, and areas for improvement.

Practice with External Sources

- o Students will regularly solve questions from standard market sources and reputed test series.
- o Each exercise will be followed **by one-to-one test discussions** with mentors to ensure **conceptual clarity and refinement of strategy**.

Prelims-Focused Phase from February

- o Starting February, preparation will shift to a "Only Prelims-focused mode".
- Every week, two Full length tests will be conducted and discussed thoroughly with mentors.

Offline Test Facility

- o In addition to online practice, an **offline test facility** will be available for students who prefer replicating the actual exam hall environment.
- o This ensures exam temperament and time management are built into preparation.

Final Stretch before Prelims

- o This cycle of tests and discussions will continue consistently until April 20.
- o This will ensure almost **one full month** of dedicated Prelims revision and practice before the examination.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Q. Is there regular one on one Mentorship?

A. Yes. One to One sessions ensure targets are set, reviewed and course corrections done. Beyond that, mentors are available 24×7 for support.

Q. Will the mentor regularly follow up and track my progress?

A. Yes. Your mentor will closely monitor your progress through regular performance reviews and targeted feedback, offering timely guidance to overcome weaknesses, build on strengths and keep you aligned with your UPSC goals.

Q. How many sessions are there per subject/theme?

A. Each major theme across GS will have 3 to 4 Answer Writing Sessions. Strategy, structure and presentation are tailored per section for example, GS1 History focuses on place, personality and time.

Q. Will there be a clear timeline for completion?

A. Yes. A detailed month wise plan is shared in advance. Prelims and Mains prep are integrated, not done in silos. You'll be Mains ready by December with manageable targets and regular progress tracking.

Q. Will there be MCQ solving sessions?

A. Yes. MCQ sessions with deconstruction, tricks and explanation will be held, focusing on logic and elimination.

Q. What about the Prelims Test Series?

A. We do not provide our own GS sectional or full-length Prelims tests. Instead, students are expected to attempt the Prelims Test Series of reputed institutes. What we offer is structured discussion, analysis, and course correction on these attempted tests. This ensures that every mistake becomes a learning opportunity, conceptual clarity improves, and preparation stays aligned with UPSC's evolving paper design.

Q. How will Prelims test discussions be conducted?

A. Each test is followed by individual one on one discussions the next day. You'll learn "first principle thinking", elimination techniques and effective solving strategies.

Q. What about the Mains Test Series?

A. You'll write 10 sectional Mains Tests by January, syllabus aligned, theme based and evaluated within 48 hours with one on one personalised feedback. Additionally, 12 Full Length Tests will be conducted between Prelims and Mains.

Q. How will current affairs be covered for both Prelims and Mains?

A. We will guide students on selecting the right sources and, more importantly, on how to approach current affairs effectively. The focus will be on differentiating Prelims-specific content from Mains-oriented content (analysis, implications, critical perspectives). Equally essential will be learning what to leave out—so that preparation remains sharp, exam-focused, and not cluttered with unnecessary information.

Q. Do I still need to join coaching if I take mentorship?

A. No. BODH is designed to complement or even replace coaching by converting your existing knowledge into results through structured strategy and feedback.

Q. Will I be ready to face the UPSC exam confidently after this?
